Dear Parishioners:

Your response to the Cardinal's Appeal has been overwhelming. The goal is \$59,000. As of last Friday you pledged \$53,315! We are \$5685 from our goal. The number of households who have participated: 69. The average gift is \$772.68. If you have not had a chance to participate, envelopes can be found in the back of the church. - 1. Last weekend's attendance: 5pm, 82; 9am, 87; 11am, 73. Live stream: Watching live: 155 households; watching later: 55. In the last three months our average in-person attendance has been roughly 67% of our pre-pandemic levels. What is interesting is that our live stream combined audience has increased in number to about 200+ each weekend, not including the occasional wedding or funeral. Like many corporations facing the dilemma of getting workers back into offices, we are confronted with a similar issue of how to increase in-person attendance. Time will tell
- 2. I would like to thank Dave Impastato, Anne Kenney, David Cartenuto, and Carol Mackey for attending the Synod meeting last Saturday at St. Patrick's in Yorktown. I will try to collate their impressions of the dynamic and substance of the day in our next FlockNote.
- 3. We are still searching for a landscaper/snow removal vendor. Thank you to everyone who has given us a referral. We are still working on it.
- 4. Last week in one of our very young CCD classes a student read the word "Indulgence" and wanted to know what it meant. If Martin Luther were alive today, his ears would be burning, his heart would be racing, and his voice would be bellowing. Over 500 years ago the church gave out pieces of paper for a donation. These papers would remit the punishment of those in

purgatory, allowing them to enter heaven more quickly, an idea that was ripe for corruption, leaving the impression one can buy one's way into heaven on the fast track. Luther rejected the whole concept and became the leading instigator for the Protestant Reformation. The Council of Trent was our response to the Protestant Reformation, and set the tone for the next 500 years until the Second Vatican Council. Believe it or not, indulgences (plenary and partial) are still on the books. Like Limbo, Indulgences are theological constructs of another time and another place. Think of this: If Christ had to carry his cross, what makes us think we can devise a shortcut?

5. April gives us a brief respite from weddings and baptisms and allows us to focus on the great mysteries of our faith. Once May commences, we hit the ground running with weddings, multiple baptisms, First Communions, and Confirmation. I can hear the swaying palm trees calling to me before the "busy" season begins.
